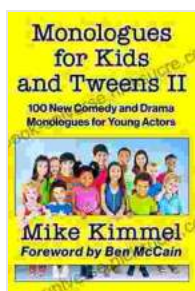

The Lost Dog

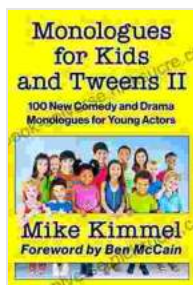
I'm so worried. My dog, Max, has been missing for two days. I've been searching everywhere for him, but I can't find him.

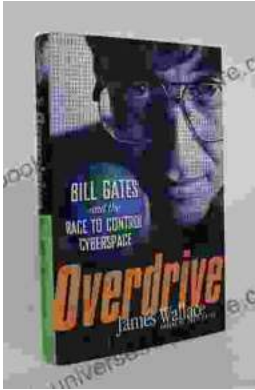

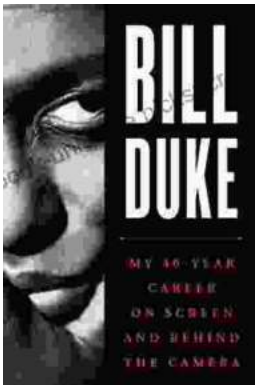
