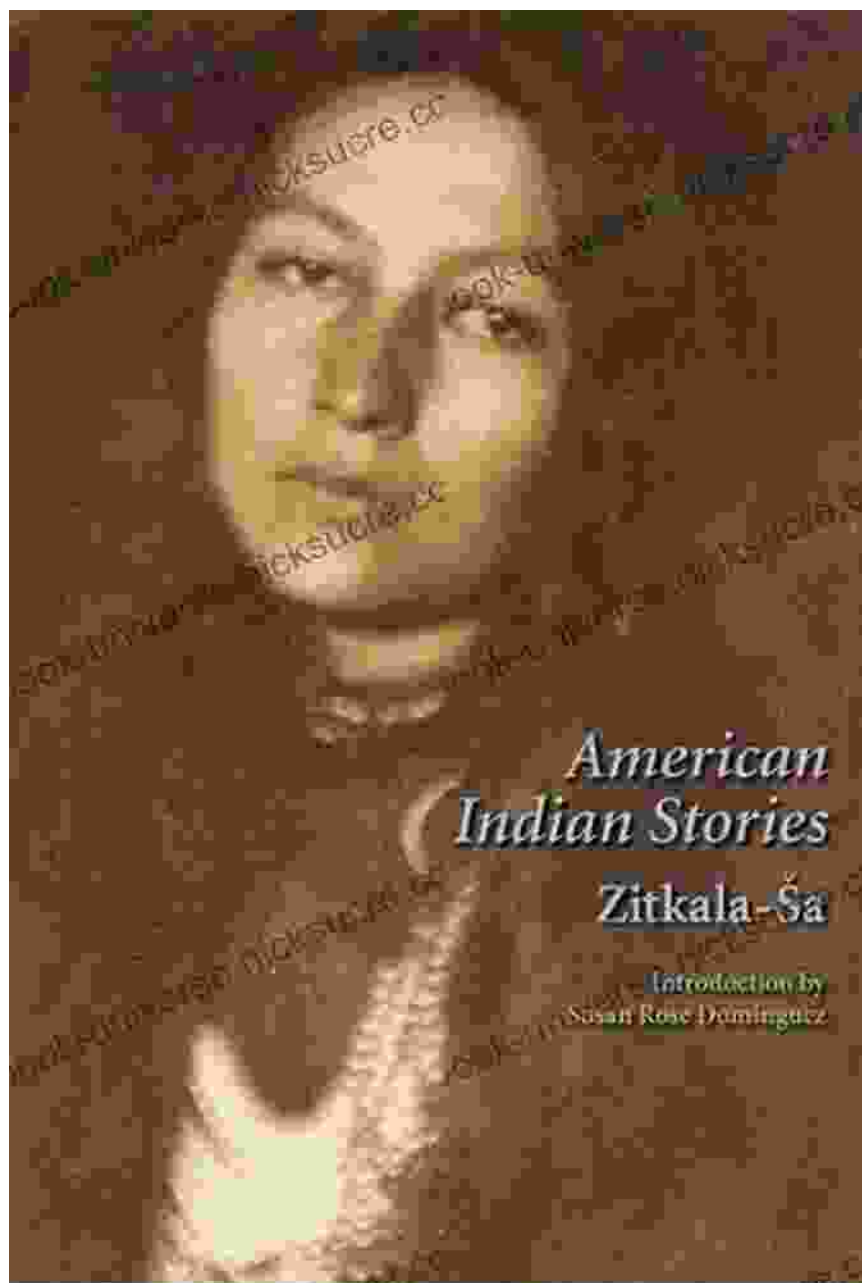

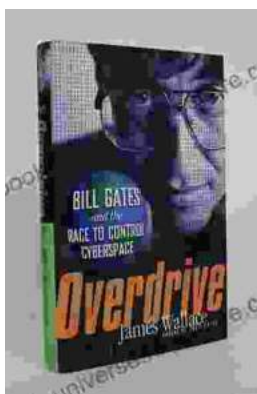

A bag of tricks, by Zitkala Sa

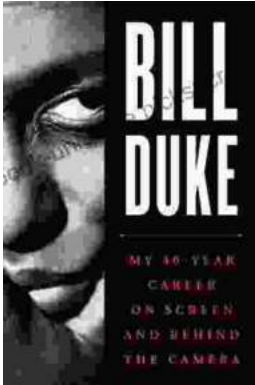
