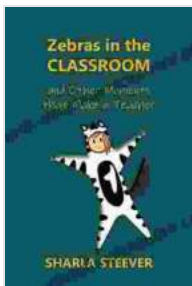

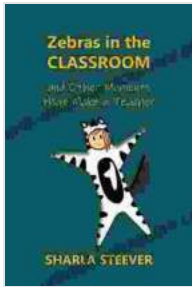
Teachers work an average of **56 hours per week**, including **18 hours per week** on activities they don't get paid for, like grading papers and supervising student clubs.

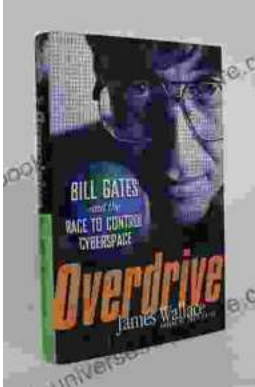

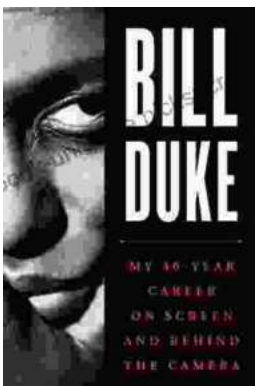
