
Personal Life

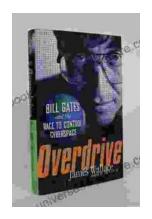

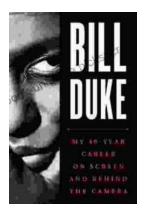
