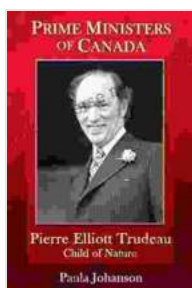


Child of Nature: Prime Ministers of Canada

Justin Trudeau

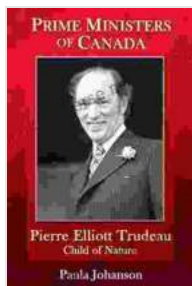

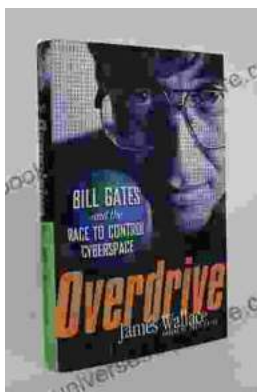
