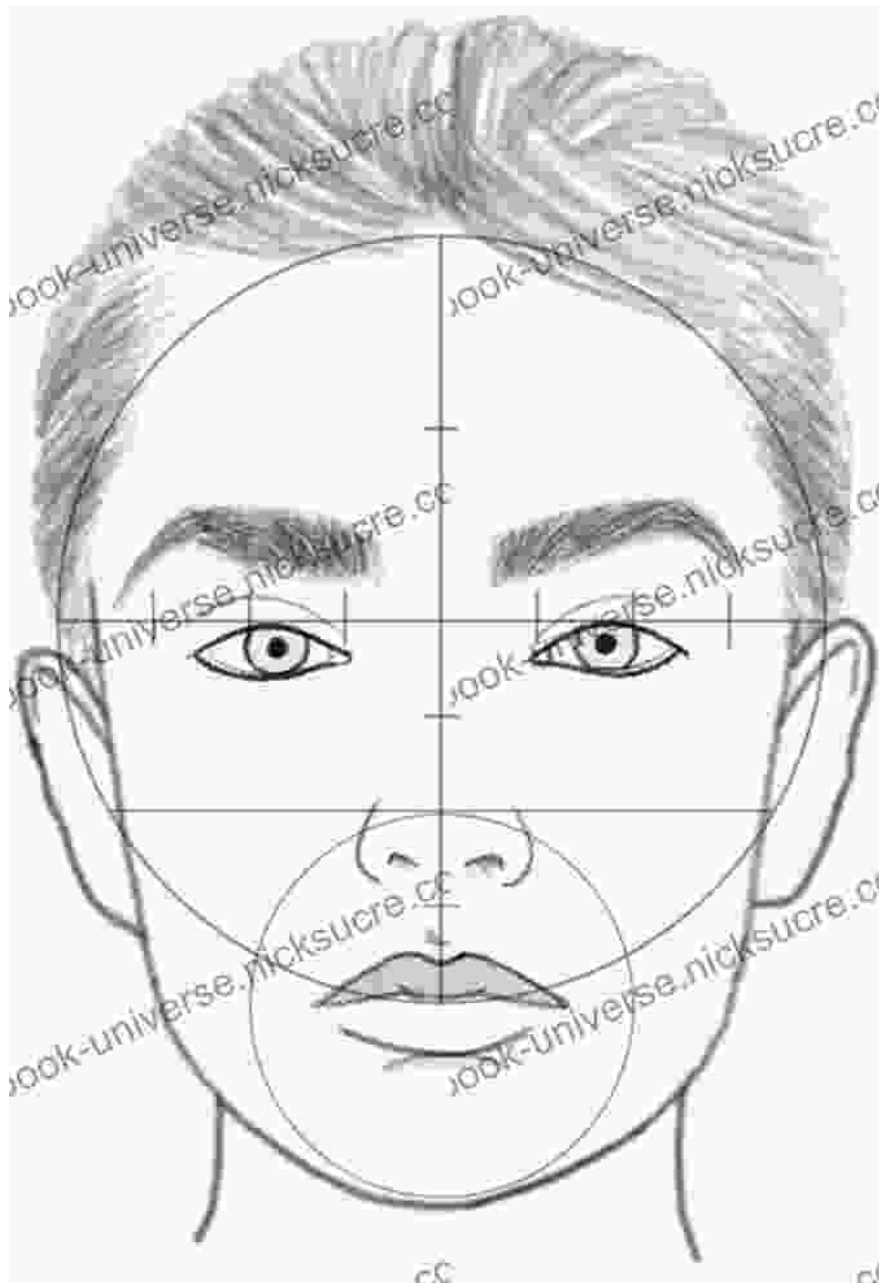

4. Draw a line for the mouth.

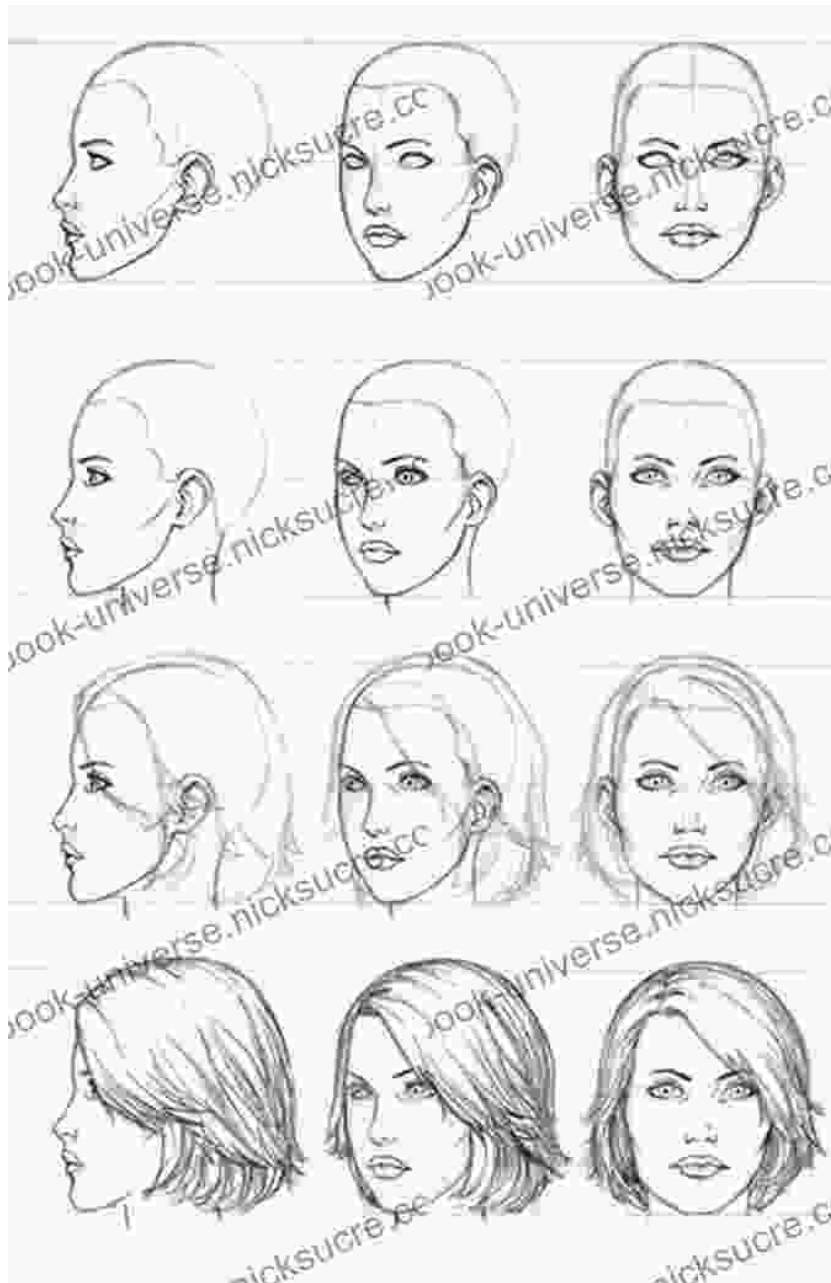

Step 2: Refine the structure.

Step 3: Add Base Colors

1. Use a flat brush to fill in the face with a base color.
2. Use the same brush to add base colors to the hair, eyebrows, and eyes.



Step 3: Add base colors.

Step 4: Shade and Highlight

1. Use a soft brush to add shadows to the face.
2. Use the same brush to add highlights to the face.
3. Use the airbrush to blend the shadows and highlights.

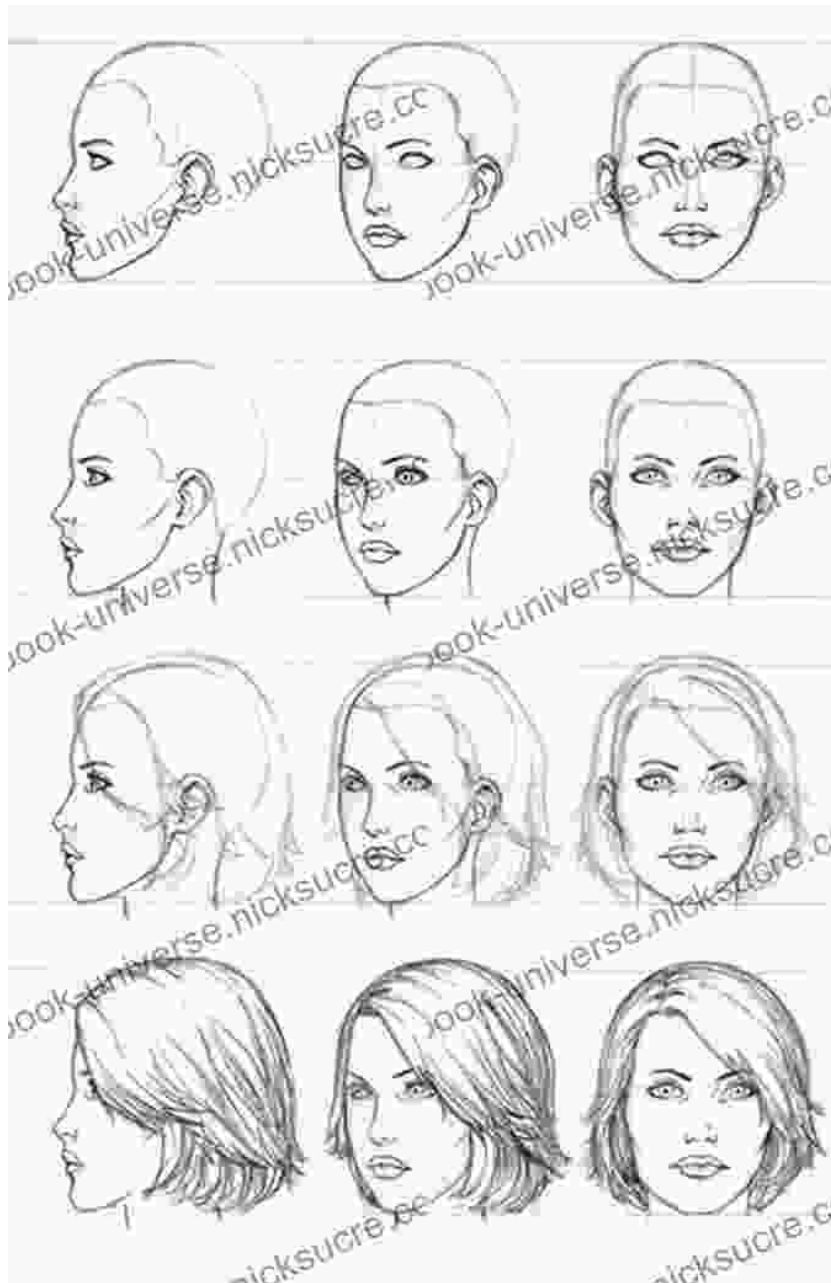

Step 4: Shade and highlight.

Step 5: Add Details

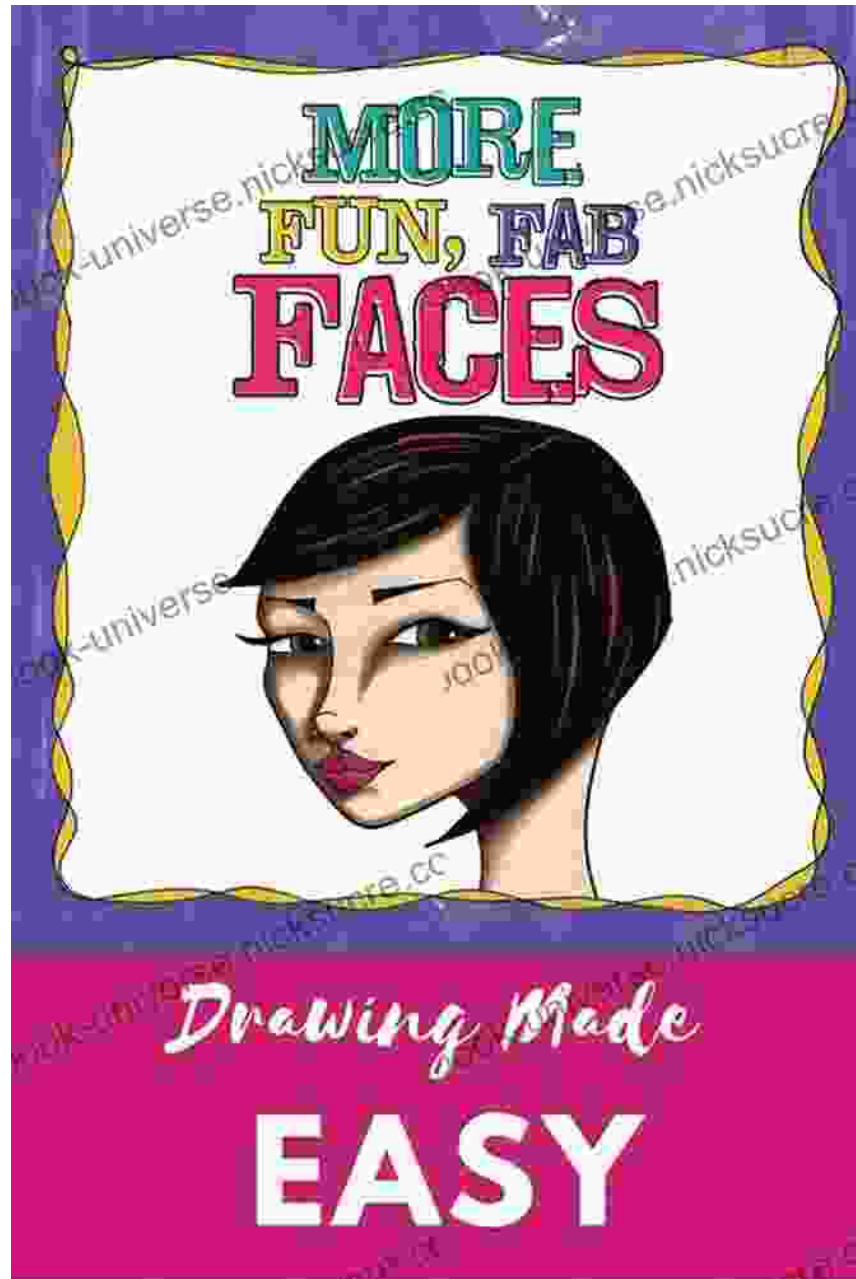
1. Use a hard brush to add details to the face, such as eyelashes, eyebrows, and freckles.
2. Use the blending brush to soften the details.



Step 5: Add details.

Step 6: Finishing Touches

1. Use the airbrush to add a soft glow to the face.
2. Use a hard brush to add a few final highlights to the face.
3. Sign your work and export it to a file format of your choice.

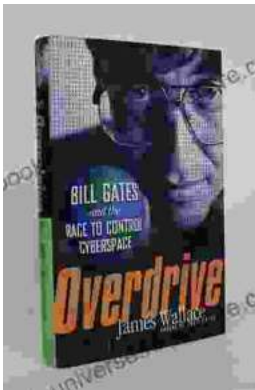

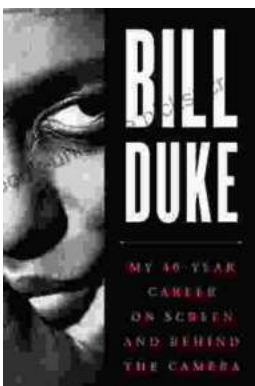
