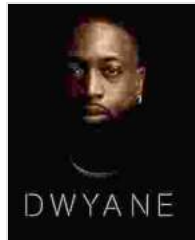

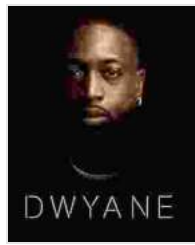

Image Caption: Dwyane Wade driving to the basket during his playing days with the Miami Heat.



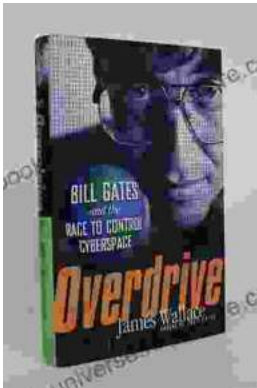

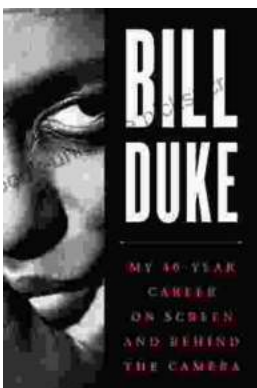
