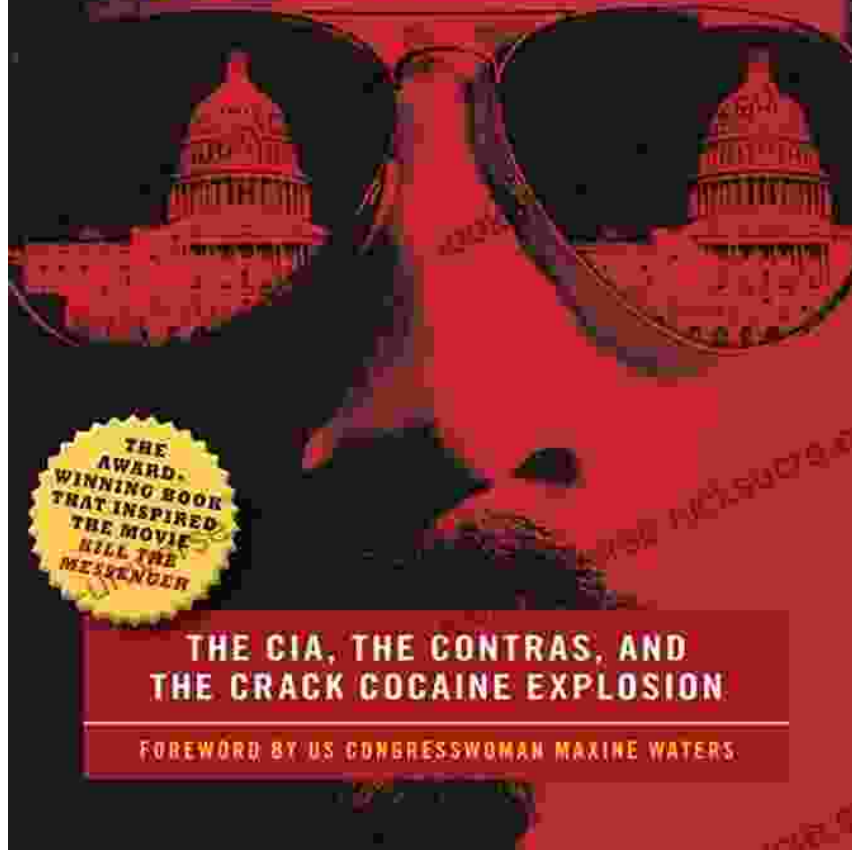

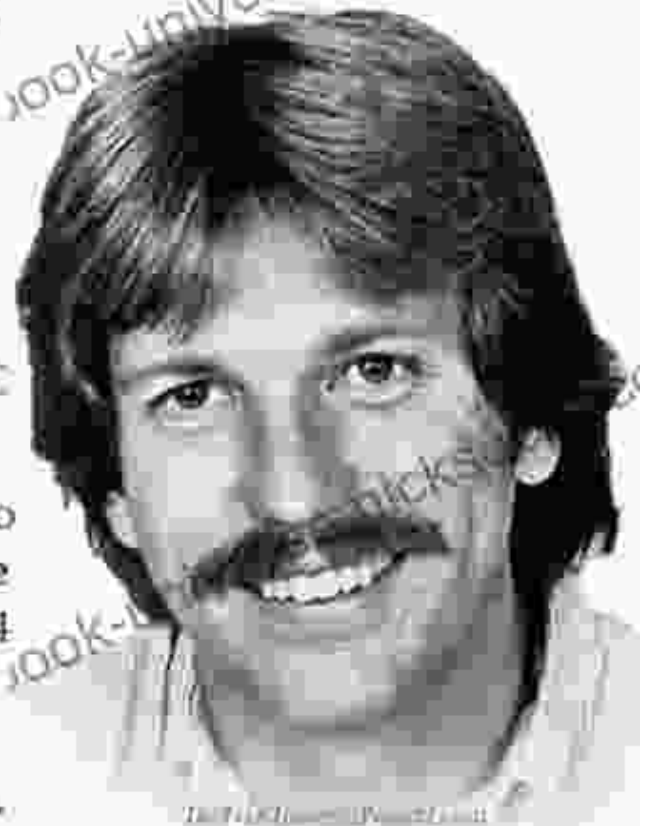
World map showing authorship of articles by region (2014-2019)

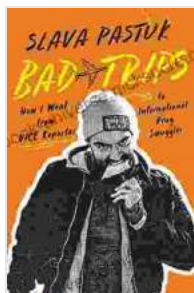

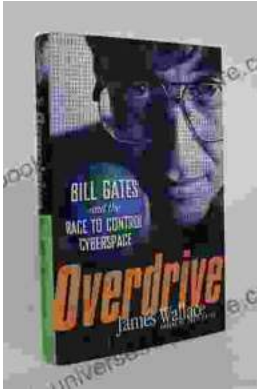

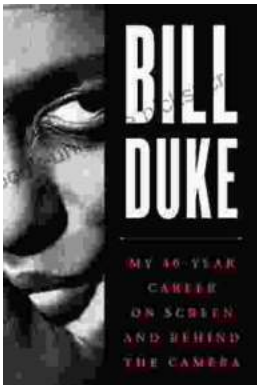
