


Over time, I started to make friends and feel more at home in the United States. I discovered that I loved learning about different cultures and meeting people from all over the world. I also started to explore my own



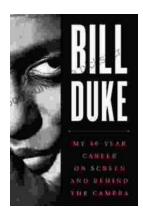
