
Riot Days: A Memoir of Incarceration in Putin's Russia by Maria Alyokhina

Conditions in IK-28



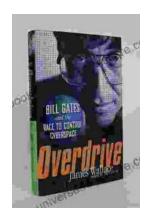
