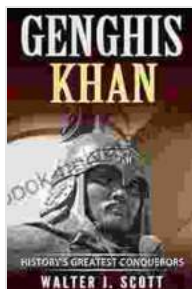

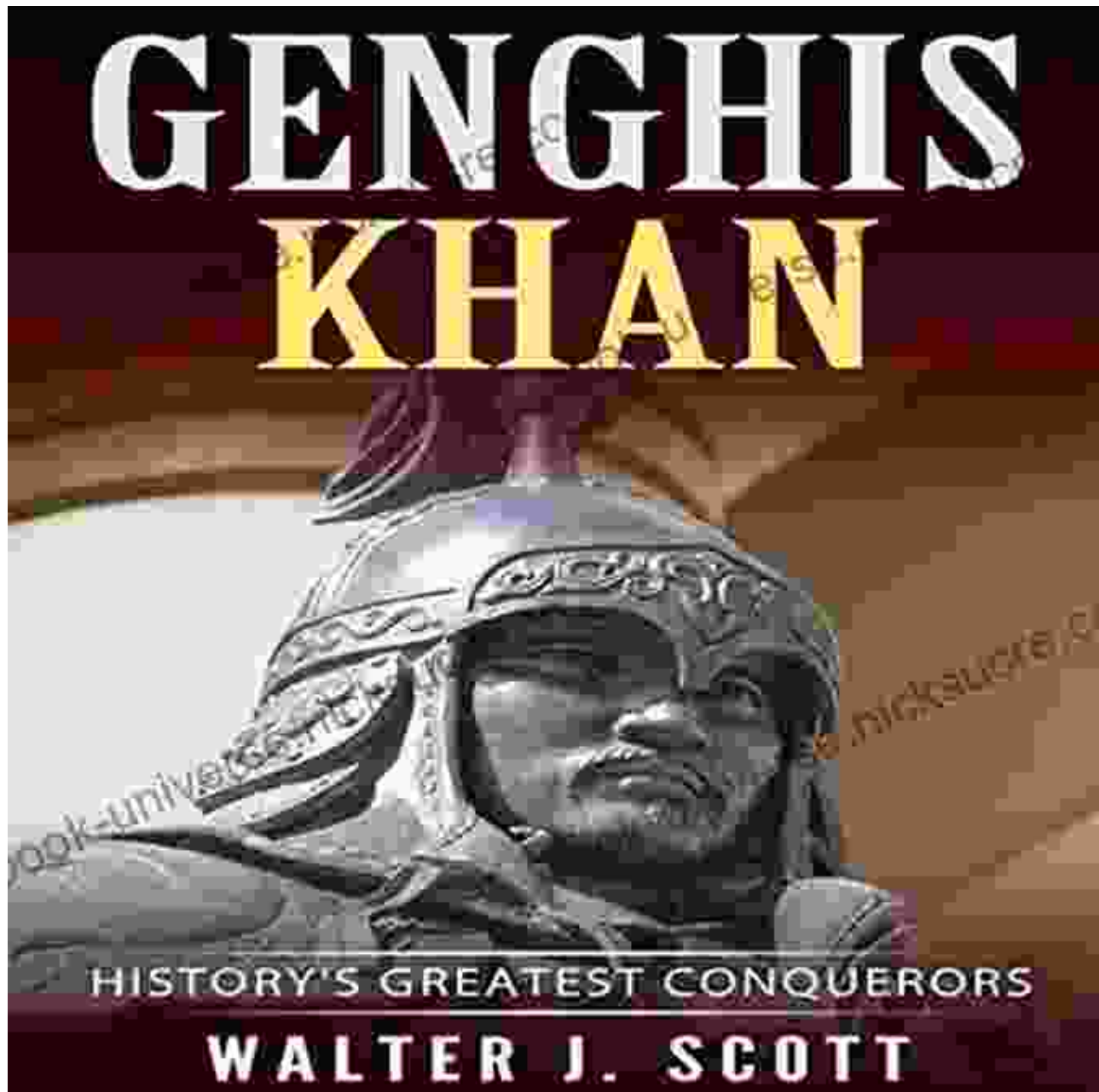

Alexander the Great



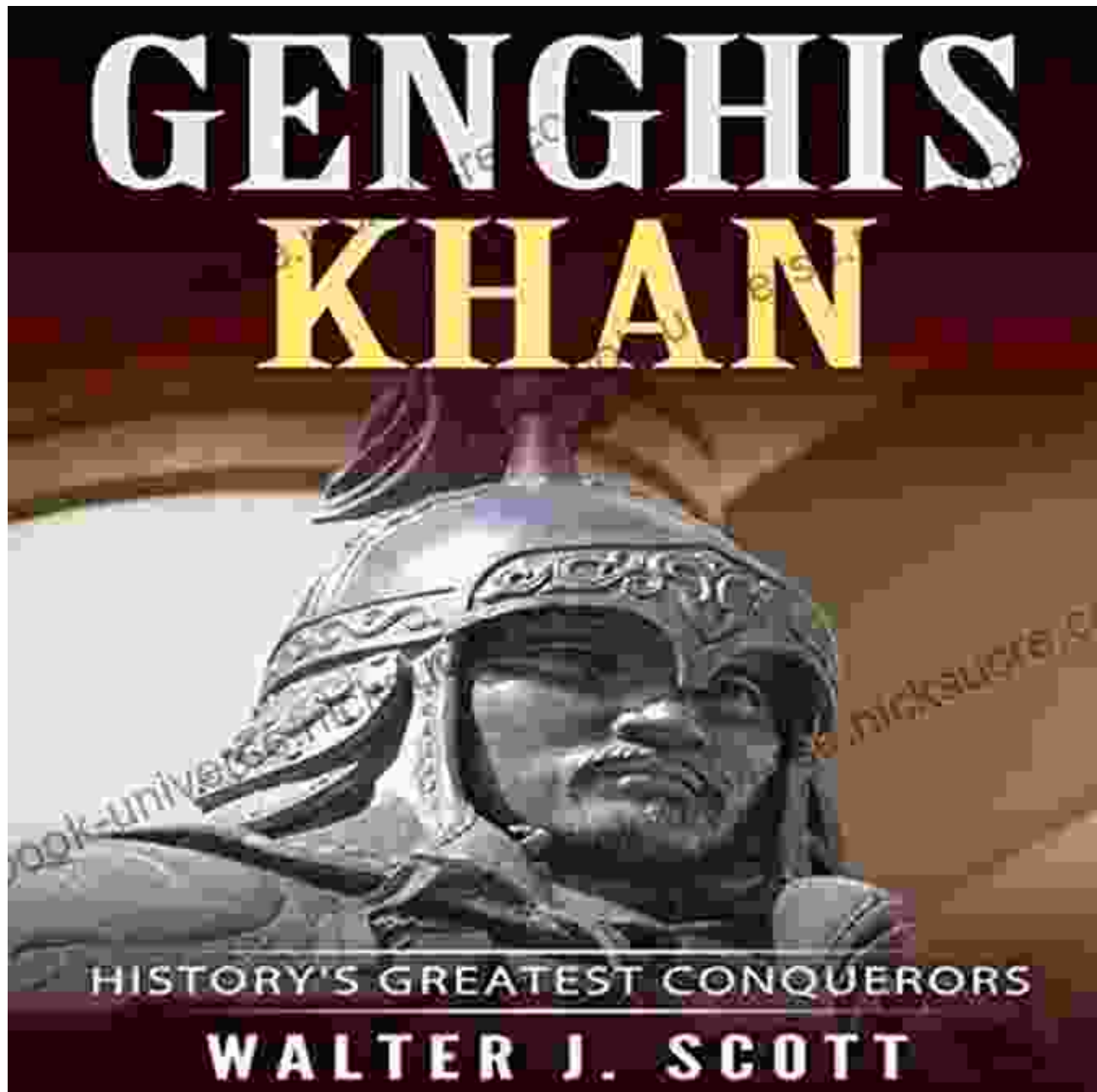
