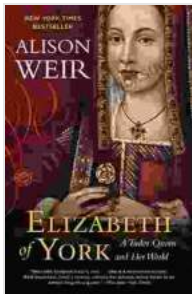

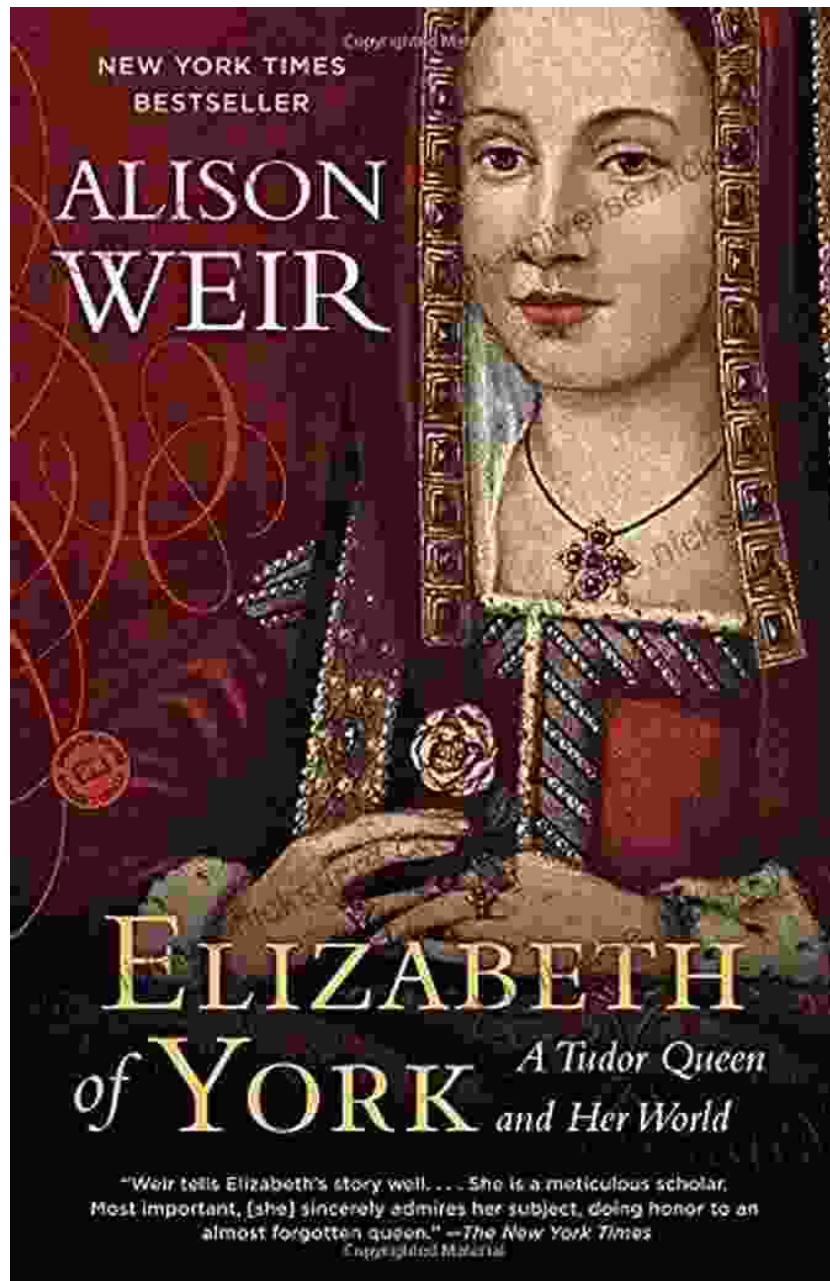
Catherine of Aragon
