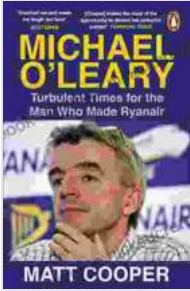


# Turbulent Times for Michael O'Leary, the Architect of Ryanair

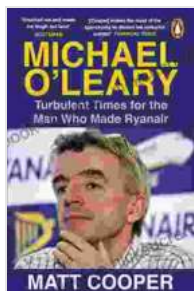

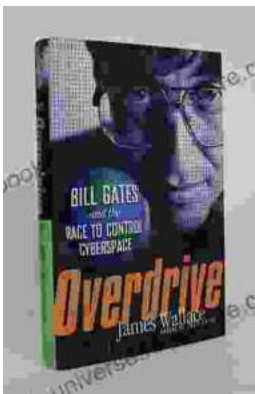

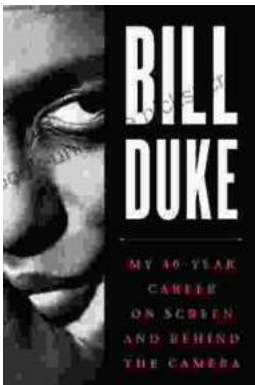
